WATER PLANT OPERATOR

ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS:

- Test water at lime and filter buildings daily, record results on log, investigate any anomalies and determine and execute corrective action if required
- Check chemical levels and refill or replace containers, initiate order if low;
- Monitor tower and finished water tank water levels and pump operations
- Observe and inspect pumps and other plant equipment, calibrate or repair as required
- Maintain records of plant maintenance
- Maintain lime and chlorine feed pumps to ensure proper dosage
- Maintain lime tank and mixer equipment
- Perform floc tank sludge removal each weekday and clean sludge beds as required
- Tour the distribution system twice weekly to identify leaks or potential backflow contamination potential and initiate corrective action if required. Maintain and repair entire distribution system as required, assist third party contractor if required.
- Clean floc tank and aerator bi-annually
- Clean settling tank semi-annually
- Perform distribution system remote testing monthly, record results
- Assist in the maintenance of records of distribution system, including valve locations and type for each connection
- Receive chemical deliveries to the plant and ensure proper storage
- Locate and mark water lines as required by Miss Utility, report outcome to Miss Utility
- Maintain supply inventory
- Backwash filters as required
- Exercise backup pumps and equipment on schedule determined by Superintendent
- Flush mains on semi-annual basis
- Maintain facility grounds including mowing grass, perform routine grounds and building maintenance including painting and repair of siding, keep all buildings and work areas clean, gravel road maintenance, keeping drainage clear.

REQUIREMENTS

- Water System Class IV Operator certification
- Ability to move 50 pound bags of lime and 100 pound tanks of chlorine;
- Employee will be subject to emergency call-outs as needed
- Work hours can be flexible

- Must arrive at work on time and maintain a regular and reliable level of attendance
- Must have the ability to use standard mechanical tools in the maintenance and repair of motors, pumps and chemical feed equipment; ability to read meters and gauges correctly
